UPDATE....

The investment philosophy is the same across all strategies. The team are looking for companies with a long history of persistent high returns, and those companies which are cheap vs the market, peers or their own history.

The total pool of available companies is 4000. They are looking for those companies with 8% p.a. real returns over an eight-year period, and low debt to equity. This then reduces the available pool to 360. In terms of selecting from this they are looking for companies undervalued by the markets and with a growing income stream. They then pick 36 equally weighted companies. This moves but is rebalanced. The average holding period is 3 to 5 years.

Like the global equity income strategy this should perform better in a down market. We can see in 2018 this didn't play out, although it has held better at the start if this year. The fund aims to outperform in weaker markets and will naturally underperform in sharply rising markets. Over 12 months and 3 years it has significantly outperformed but since launch it has only slightly outperformed.

In terms of what has done well for the fund, this includes Elite Material, Novatek Microelectronics, China Medical System, Qualcomm and B3. Detractors to performance include Indiabulls Housing Finance, Truworths, JSE, KT&G and St Shine Optical.

They sold Indiabulls and purchased Largan. Other changes include China Minsheng Bank, being replaced by China Merchants Bank, and Infosys being replaced by Tech Mahindra.

Looking at the markets they see growth of 4.5% in 2020, rising to 4.7% in 2021. The average company has low levels of debt and there is significant improvement in earnings growth. In terms of risk the trade dispute remains but they think this is easing in the short term. The virus remains a risk, but they

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see this as different from others and don't see that it will have any long-term impact, although they expect it to bring volatility to the market.

In summary, not much has changed from when we reviewed last year. One change that is being made is that they will be incorporating A shares into the investment process. The fund still hasn't really delivered in down markets as we would expect but it is very early days. There are many different options within emerging markets and this might be a fund to monitor at this stage.
