The Fund will invest at least 67% of its assets in companies listed or traded on a Regulated Market worldwide.

UPDATE....

These updates have been written at the time of the Coronavirus Pandemic of 2020, which has impacted the global financial markets in a way that has never been seen before.

A few years ago we uncovered this fund. It had had several years of poor performance and then suddenly it had 12 months of exceptional performance. We met the manager and found out that he had recently taken this on and had spent a period rebuilding the strategy, and the exceptional performance reflected those changes.

Since then the performance has remained strong, although the manager has now retired. This update was to meet the new team. Our initial thoughts were that the drive that was behind the old manager is not there in the new team. The team were quick to add that nothing has changed, and the investment process would remain the same. To some extent you want this, but you also want a period of reflection. Is what was right a few years ago still the same? Are the holdings still the right ones? None of this was mentioned by the team.

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Although the performance has been strong, we can see that it has started to slip and our concern is whether the new team can carry forward the legacy. This update covered both a macro view, and where the fund is currently positioned.

They remain very positive, especially in North Asia. The tailwinds include phased normalisation, fiscal stimulus across developed and emerging markets, limited dependency on oil and gas, global funds are underweight emerging markets and there is now a stabilisation of outflows. In terms of headwinds these include second wave of the virus, removal of stimulus packages, subdued business/consumer sentiment, rising unemployment, prolonged recovery, lower growth, US election uncertainty, and escalating trade/tech tensions.

In terms of companies in Asia, the majority are expected to outgrow developed economy businesses, and yet the relative price to book is on a 34% discount to developed markets and 18% to history. These businesses have significantly lower levels of dept and healthy cash balance sheets. Emerging markets also make up 87% of the world's population and 57% of the world's growth.

The fund focuses on healthcare, enterprises, households, and technology. Examples of holdings include:

5G – TSMC, China Communication Services, Tech Mahindra Data Centres, Digitalisation and Industrial IoT – WEG, Samsung, Accton Technology Financial – AIA, Bank Central Asia, Bajaj Finance

The focus of the fund is to find a few well managed companies using a developed markets mindset. They have reduced holdings in China as they worry about the impact of increased tensions with the US and a Trump victory. They see great opportunities in North Asia, especially China, Korea, and Taiwan. They feel India and Indonesia have not responded as well in the recent climate but there are positive reforms coming through. In Latin America, many economies have failed to stop the spread of the virus and they have moved underweight to the region because of the potential damage.

In summary, this had an excellent manager, however, the performance, although beating the benchmark, has dropped behind its peers. Any change in management, even if it is within the existing team, would expect challenges and potential changes. The concern is that none of this seems to be happening. The team also seem very downbeat about China which they may be right about, but it appears they are talking more about China as an exporter rather than the domestic growth story within China. Potential investors need to therefore decide whether to hold with the existing team or watch and wait.
