UPDATE....

These updates have been written at the time of the Coronavirus Pandemic of 2020, which has impacted the global financial markets in a way that has never been seen before.

This was part of a Nomura investor day with an introduction to a range of funds and strategies. This is a global high conviction fund with 32 holdings. Looking at the high-level data the fund seems to be strong in a rising market but protects less on the downside. The batting average is above 50 and probably reflects the weaker performance in down markets. Having said that the performance is strong, but it is worth comparing to other strategies.

They feel that Asia as a region has made the concept of investing in emerging markets redundant because this region is the key driver of returns. They believe there are plenty of opportunities and the region is recovering at a faster pace to the rest of the world. It is at its cheapest level for over a decade and continues to see outflows from investors.

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Although regions and sectors do not drive the fund there is a natural overweight to China, Korea, Taiwan and Singapore, with sectors being consumer and technology. The fund is positioned to benefit from those areas which are leading the economic recovery. They have no exposure to Thailand, Malaysia, and the Philippines.

They believe their strength is having people based locally and managers specialising across markets and regions. The fund is about having the best companies across the region. Their filtering process reduces the choice to around 80 companies and from this they look to own 30 to 35 companies.

Some of the holdings and companies they like include China Tourism Group, which is the largest duty free operator in China with a 90% market share, TSMC who are the leading semiconductor foundry in the world and are now bigger than Intel, and SEA Ltd who are the leading online gaming and ecommerce platform in South East Asia.

In summary, this fund has delivered strong out performance by focusing on a few high-quality Asian companies. Clearly having experts in the field is an important part of that strategy. We would want to understand more about how they select companies, their holding period and sell side before making any final decision on this fund.
